C129 Chairman's opening remarks

The Chairman welcomed members to the meeting.

C130 Code of Conduct – declarations of interest

C131 Apologies for absence

The Chairman reported an apology for absence from Councillor Banner because of family illness.

C132 Minutes of the previous meeting

Resolved,

C133 Co-option of members

Further to Minute C116 – 31 January 2025 the Clerk reported that no applications had been received by the closing date of 21 February 2025. The Council reviewed the procedure for filling the vacancies including additional measures to publicise the vacancies: Resolved.

C136 Policing of Woolston – community liaison report

The Clerk reported that a Police representative was unable to attend the meeting for operational reasons. The Council considered the monthly report provided by the Police for March 2025:

C137 Borough Council business

The Council received reports from Borough Councillors on matters under consideration by the Borough Council relating to the parish and on issues that they had acted on for residents since the last meeting and other issues relating to responsibilities of the Borough Council. (The Council noted that the reports related to the parish council area and not to the wider area of the Rixton and Woolston Borough Ward unless there was an issue of interest to Woolston).

Reports from Borough Councillors

Councillor Tynan reported on his attendance at attended a consultation event held by Warrington Primary Academy Trust on changing the Bruche Primary Academy School on Seymour Drive into an All Through School for ages 2 to 16 years from September 2026. This would create a new two form entry secondary school. He had also attended in his role as Chairman of the Council as a nearby parish council consultee. Councillor Sheridan reported on the proposed half mile limit for the school catchment area and on action to improve to road safety.

Matters raised with the Borough Council

- Borough Council review of road safety on Holes Lane, Hillock Lane and Gig Lane no further information to report.
- A57 Manchester Road construction of a new pedestrian island on Manchester Road just to the west of the junction with Weir Lane (Minute C121 21 January 2025). No further information to report.

Parish Path Warden scheme – condition report

Councillor Nowell reported on matters relating to public footpaths and on issues that had been reported to the Borough Council:

New Cut Canal towpapth – deterioration of the edge of the tarmac path alongside the canal particularly on a lengthy section near Weir Lane. Similar repair works were needed in November 2020 along lengths of the path. Concern had been posted on local social media at the poor state of the path. Photographs were available for the Clerk for reference purposes.

Moss Brow – path diversion by the Borough Council – no further information to report.

- 1. the Borough Council be requested to carry out an urgent inspection of the towpath and the issue be formally raised at the Public Rights of Way Forum;
- 2. the Borough Council be asked to report on action proposed for the diversion of the path at Moss Brow.

Members raised concerns at the riding of scrambler bikes and electric bikes along the towpath and through Paddington Meadows. It was noted that incidents could be reported to the Police as part of their Operation Scrambler initiative.

- Friends of Woolston Park group Councillor Klein no matters to report. Councillor Kilgannon reported that Warrington Sea Cadets had been made aware of the group.
- Public Rights of Way Forum no meeting held.

Woolston Neighbourhood Hub – Woolston Surgery

Councillor Rydzkowski reported concern on the condition of the rooms used by the Padgate Medical Centre for the Woolston Surgery at Woolston Neighbourhood Hub. The Practice Manager had contacted Warrington Borough Council, as landlord, identifying the issues requiring urgent action including:

- Leaks to the roof leading to concern in providing Primary Care Services to patients having regard to infection control and health and safety risks.
- Recent periods of heavy rainfall had caused one of the three consulting rooms and one of the reception desks to be taken out of use.
- Risks posed to patients who have open wounds, those with respiratory conditions and those who are immunosuppressed.
- Concern for the safety of patients and staff when floors are wet and slippy.

The assistance given by the LiveWire staff where possible had been acknowledged. Resolved.

That the Chief Executive be requested to review the action being taken by officers to ensure that the Woolston Surgery can continue to deliver medical services to the community.
