EA91 Development adjacent to the Thelwall Viaduct

EA92 Parish Path Warden Scheme

Councillor Nowell reported and the Committee noted the items reported to Borough Council Rights of Way officer and responses received:

- An updated advice note had been received from the Borough Council's Rights of Way officer on the role of Parish Path Wardens, including new Health and Safety advice.
- Water logging of the rights of way through Woolston Park near Pipe Lane had been notified to the Borough Council who had responded that capital investment would be needed to alleviate the drainage issue. None was available at this time but the matter could be considered in a future funding round.

EA93 Hillock Lane Amenity Area – development of improvement scheme

The Committee noted that there was no further information to report.

EA94 Hillock Lane Amenity Area – security of car park entrance

The Committee noted that a quotation had been invited for the installation of timber fencing to improve security at the car park entrance.

<u>EA95 Tree condition survey - Hillock Lane Amenity area and Martinscroft Village</u> Green

The Committee received a copy of the reports following the periodic survey of the condition of trees at these sites. Quotations had been invited for works categorised as a safety priority:

<u>EA96 Somerset Way at entrance to Woolston Park – consideration of measures to protect highway verge</u>

The Committee gave consideration further to minute EA84 21 March 2018 following reports of the parking of vehicles on the highway verge and on Somerset Way causing an obstruction:

EA99 New Cut Heritage and Ecology Trail Group – issues relating to Woolston

The play area at Nottingham Close had a no smoking sign on the entrance gates but a similar notice was not sited at Weir Lane play area.
