C41 Apologies for absence

The Council noted apologies for absence from Councillor A Hill through ill-health.

C42 Minutes of the previous meeting

Resolved.

That

- 1. the minutes of the meeting held on 30 September 2020 be taken as read and confirmed as a correct record. The minutes, as approved, to be signed by the Chairman at the next physical meeting;
- 2. the process at meetings of individual approval of matters involving finance be approved.

C43 Matters of report from the previous meeting

C44 Policing of Woolston – community liaison report

The Council considered the report provided by the Police for October 2020:

C45 Borough Council business

Borough Councillors McCarthy and Wright reported on matters under consideration by the Borough Council relating to the parish and on issues that the Borough Ward members had acted on for residents including:

 Work was being carried out on improving cycle and path ways following the provision of additional funding by the Government.

- Broken fencing adjacent to the highway on north side of A57 Manchester Road (opposite junction with Weir Lane). Repair work was to be carried out but had been delayed.
- Maintenance was to be carried out to the path leading from the Hillock Lane Amenity area to the playing fields.
- The repainting of road markings in Hillock Lane had been delayed but was included in the programme.
- It was noted that, following the approval by the Planning Inspectorate of the planning appeal lodged in respect of the premises of Mincrete at Bridge Road, it was likely that this may lead to further development of the site.
- An update had been requested on the commencement of the Sainsbury's local store at Manchester Road/New Cut Lane.
- Officers were investigating a complaint from a resident at the flooding of their garden from Woolston Playing Fields.
- A request had been reported from a resident for fallen leaves to be cleared from the former play area at Poulton Crescent. It was noted that leaf sweepers had been working in the area. An update was to be requested on plans for the future use of the area.
- It was noted that noise nuisance from the premises of Mincrete at Bridge Road had reduced following action by officers in liaison with residents.
- The use of off-road motor bikes in the New Cut Lane/Bridge Road area had been reported to the Police.

Councillor M Greenslade reported her concern at the absence of a report from Councillor Hill, when unable to attend a meeting, on the matters that he was acting on as Borough Ward Councillor. Councillors McCarthy and Wright reported that the three Ward Councillors aimed to work together to cover matters relating to Woolston and would review the reporting of work to the Council meeting:

C46 Committee matters

(1) Environment and Amenities Committee

(a) Woolston Playing Fields and Hillock Lane Amenity area – application for siting of storage equipment

Councillor McCarthy reported further to minute C34(1)(a) – 30 September 2020 that he had contacted officers requesting for action to be taken on the request from Woolston Rovers FC for the siting of a new storage facility on the playing fields. It was noted that the Club had sited their new goal posts, funded through grant aid, to the rear of the boundary with the Kings Leadership Academy as a temporary measure. Officers has been requested to contact the Clerk to progress this matter:

Resolved,

That the action taken be approved.

(b) Hydropol scheme, Weir Lane - update

The Chairman reported that the Project Coordinator for Hydropol had continued to provide updates to the Council and the administrator for the local Facebook site on the scheme.

The company had cooperated, where possible, in scheduling deliveries of material and equipment to the site to avoid disruption to traffic on Weir Lane and to services held at SS Peter and Michael RC Church.

It was noted that the company was in discussion with Scottish Power plc on the completion of the reinstatement works to the highway in Weir Lane and at the New Cut Canal viewing area:

(c) Battery Lane Allotment Site – action following inspection of plots

The Clerk reported further to minute C34(1)(e) – 30 September 2020 on action taken in respect of a plot where notices had been issued and no satisfactory improvement had been made. The tenant had submitted an explanation for the lack of cultivation and a work plan for returning the plot to a satisfactory condition. Following consultation with the Chairman of the Environment and Amenities Committee, the undertaking to maintain the plot had been accepted:

(b) Annual Service of Remembrance 2020 – report on implementation of alternative arrangements during the Covid 19 emergency

The Chairman reported further to minute C34 (2)(b) – 30 September 2020 that he had laid the wreath at the memorial on behalf of the Council. Reverend Rebecca Roberts of the Church of the Ascension had attended together with the flag bearer as a representative of the Royal British Legion. The Government's Covid guidance had been followed during the proceedings. A submission was to be made by Rev Roberts to the local Facebook site. It was noted that other organisations and members of the public were expected to leave items of remembrance at the memorial in the coming days:

(c) request for enhancement of the website

The Clerk reported further to minute C34(2)(c)(1) - 30 September 2020 on the response from the website provider for enhancing the website. Details had been provided of features available on the system, but it was not possible to upgrade to provide features available on more advanced websites. The present system had been selected to meet the statutory requirements at the time of purchase:

The Clerk reported further to minute C34(2)(c)(2) - 30 September 2020 that the website provider had completed the work to achieve compliance of the website with The Public Sector Bodies (Website and Mobile Applications) Accessibility Regulations 2018 to meet the WCAG 2.1 AA standard. Members were asked to assist in identifying comments from users who should benefit from the upgrade of the site:

(e) Powers for the control of dogs in public places

The Council gave consideration further to minute C34(2)(d) - 30 September 2020 on the powers for the control of dogs in public places:

That the Council help, as necessary, in identifying the responsible body when issues are raised eg Cheshire Constabulary, Warrington Borough Council (Animal Wardens), the Royal Society for the Protection of Animals.

(f) Woolston with Martinscroft Poppy Appeal scheme – to report on progress by the group with arrangements for 2020

Further to minute C34(2)(e) - 30 September 2020, the Council noted that the group had successfully provided poppy emblems on lampposts along A57 Manchester Road from the M6 motorway roundabout to New Cut Lane including the area of trees on the triangle adjacent to old Manchester Road. It had been reported on the local Facebook site that the group had raised more than £1,000 for the Royal British Legion Poppy Appeal. The Chairman reported that he had posted a message on the site congratulating the group for their effort:

C47 Reports from members appointed to local bodies

The Council received reports from members who were appointed by the Council or other organisations on local bodies including:

- New Cut Heritage and Ecology Trail Group Councillor J Greenslade reported that no meetings of the group had taken place since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic. The group continued to update their website and Facebook site, including photographs of the area covered by the group.
- Friends of Woolston Park Councillor MH Greenslade reported that the group continued to work (with suitable social distancing) in the park throughout the current Covid-19 pandemic. Many favourable comments had been made to the group, both in the park and on the POWP Facebook page, from residents, many who had enjoyed the park as their form of exercise during this time.
 - The Young Friends of Woolston Park had regrouped (with suitable risk assessments, supervision and required social distancing) and had recently been busy planting spring bulbs in memory of David Pearce (late husband of Parish Councillor Marian Pearce, who had donated the bulbs).
 - A request was submitted from the Chair and Deputy Chair of FOWP group for funding to purchase equipment for use by the volunteers.
- Public Rights of Way Forum Councillor Nowell reported that no meeting had been held. The path along the canal from New Cut Lane to Bridge Lane had reopened following completion of maintenance work.

- 2. approval be given to a grant of £500 to the Friends of Woolston Park Group in support of their volunteer work in Woolston Park

– Warrington Local Plan update

The Council noted that the Borough Council was pausing work on its Local Plan, in response to the impact of Covid-19, along with the Government's proposed planning reforms and new housing calculation methodology. It was anticipated the Borough Council would be able to progress the Local Plan in the summer of 2021.
