# MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE WOOLSTON PARISH COUNCIL HELD AT THE WOOLSTON NEIGHBOURHOOD HUB, HALL ROAD, WOOLSTON ON 6 DECEMBER 2023

#### C60 Appointment of Chairman

Resolved,

That in the absence of the Chairman and Vice Chairman, Councillor Banner be appointed as Chairman of this meeting.

#### C61 Chairman's remarks

The Chairman welcomed members and members of the public to the meeting.

#### <u>C62 Code of Conduct – Declarations of Interest</u> <u>Relevant Authorities (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests) Regulations 2012</u>

There were no declarations of interest.

#### C63 Apologies for absence

Apologies for absence were received from Councillors J Greenslade, MH Greenslade, AJ Hill and D Hill through illness.

#### C64 Minutes of the previous meeting

Resolved,

That the minutes of the meeting held on 11 October 2023 be taken as read and signed as a correct record.

#### C65 Policing of Woolston

#### - Warrington Working Together event 2 November 2023

Neighbourhood Sergeant Gulam attended the meeting, with PCSO Roberts, and he gave a report on action arising from the Warrington Working Together event held on 2 November 2023 in the Woolston Church of the Ascension. Warrington Borough Council had also been represented at the event.

The event had been hosted by Cheshire Police in response to requests the community had made at a recent Working Together event held in Warrington convened by the Police and Crime Commissioner. The event had been publicised by the parish council and was well attended by residents. Officers from Cheshire Police and the Borough Council responded to

questions from residents regarding the use by the Home Office of the Holiday Inn for people seeking asylum in the country and other issues relating to Woolston.

Sgt. Gulam reported that over 80 people had given feedback on issues of concern and further reports had been received after the event. A response had been given to each incident reported. There had been an increase in the number of patrols in the area since the event.

The need to report incidents to the Police was emphasised to allow any necessary action to be prioritised. It was noted that following a request from the Council, Cheshire Police and Warrington BC had provided a joint response on how to report a crime, incident or suspicion together with other information. This had been published on the local media site and by the Council:

#### Resolved,

That Cheshire Police be thanked for their action in hosting the event and the action taken in response to incidents reported and the concerns of residents continue to be monitored by the Council.

#### <u>– community liaison report</u>

The Council considered the monthly reports for October and November 2023:

#### Resolved,

That the monthly reports for October and November 2023 be noted. (*Please see appendix for a copy of the reports*).

#### C66 Holiday Inn – use by the Home Office

Further to Minute C51 – 11 October 2023, the Clerk reported the responses from Warrington Borough Council, Charolotte Nichols MP (Warrington North), Andy Carter MP (Warrington South), the Police and Crime Commissioner for Cheshire and the Home Office to the questions raised by residents relating to the use by the Home Office for accommodating persons seeking asylum in this country.

The Borough Council's Head of Strategic Support and Communities had attended the event on 2 November 2023 hosted by the Police and reported the information provided to the Council in response to questions from residents in addition to other questions from the those attending. This included the representations and objections made by the Borough Council to the Home Office when consulted on the proposed use. The Borough Council liaised with both Members of Parliament, Cheshire Police and health agencies amongst others on the effects of the use made of the accommodation.

The Council noted the information in the national media on proposals by the Government relating to the use of hotel accommodation and generally on the issue of persons seeking asylum:

#### Resolved,

That the response be noted and the use made of this accommodation continue to be monitored in liaison with Cheshire Police and Warrington Borough Council.

#### C67 Matters of report from previous minutes

No matters to report.

#### C68 Borough Council business

The Council received reports from Borough Councillors on matters under consideration by the Borough Council relating to the parish and on issues that they had acted on for residents since the last meeting and other issues relating to responsibilities of the Borough Council. (The Council noted that the reports related to the parish council area and not to the wider area of the Rixton and Woolston Borough Ward unless there was an issue of interest to Woolston).

- 1 Reports from Borough Councillors
  - Councillor Tynan

1. The Borough Council had reinstated the bus shelter on the A57 Manchester Road, adjacent to the junction with Laburnum Avenue;

- 2. Representations had been to officers on the procedures for the installation of telecommunications masts.
- 2. Matters raised with the Borough Council
- 2.1 Borough Council Review of road safety on Holes Lane, Hillock Lane and Gig Lane -Borough Ward Councillors were asked to raise again the request for 20mph restrictions on Hillock Lane, Dam Lane and roads adjacent to schools – no information to report.

Resolved,

That the report be noted, and the identified action approved.

#### C69 Committee matters

The Council considered matters relating to the undermentioned committees:

#### (1) Environment and Amenities Committee

#### 1. Parish Path Warden scheme - condition report

Councillor Nowell reported on matters relating to public footpaths and on issues that had been reported to the Borough Council:

- New Cut towpath palisade fencing leaning over the path; wall of soil collapsing over the path. Noted that vegetation had been cut back on lengths of the path.
- Thelwall Lane to Woolston Eyes that the Peak and Northern Footpath Society be requested to provide information on paths in this area.

Resolved,

That the report be noted.

#### 2. Martinscroft Green – recreational use and maintenance of trees

Further to Minute C54(1)2. – 11 October 2023 it was noted that a date had not yet been offered for a site meeting with the arboricultural consultant.

#### 3. Development of "Old Billy" scheme

Further to Minute C54(1) 3. – 11 October 2023, the Clerk reported that work was proceeding with the illustrator of the Old Billy book in using images for the signs along the New Cut canal. These were expected to be received during December 2023 and the scheme could then proceed to approval by the Council for consultation with outside bodies to be partners to the scheme. Councillor Rydzkowski reported that information had been provided to the Poulton with Fearnhead parish council on the scheme. The Council considered action to avoid delay in the implementation of the scheme:

Resolved,

That

1. the report be accepted;

2. details of the scheme and the proposed signs be supplied to members, the Poulton with Fearnhead parish council and the New Cut Heritage and Ecology Trail Group;

3. to avoid delay, the Clerk be authorised to proceed with the implementation of the scheme in consultation with the Chairman and Vice Chairman and the Chairman of the Finance and General Committee, subject to there being no unresolved issues after considering the results of consultation.

(Councillor Banner declared a non-pecuniary interest by reason of being Chair of Culture *Warrington*)

#### 4. Ranger Cabin, Woolston Park - representations to the Borough Council

Further to Minute C54(1)5. – 11 October 2023, the Clerk reported that no further response had been received to the representations made to the Borough Council on the provision of a replacement facility.

A request had been received from the Friends of Woolston Park group to support the repairs proposed to the Ranger Cabin by allocating the grant from the Council for 2023/24 to this work. Councillor Smith gave details of the works proposed and the allocation of £500 of the Group's resources to assist in meeting the estimated cost of materials of £2000. Bruche Athletic JFC has set up a Just Giving appeal and further fundraising is planned. The current proposal was that members of both groups would combine to make the repairs. The Group had held a meeting on 20 November 2023 with the Environment Services Manager of the Borough Council also attended by the Chairman of Bruche Athletic JFC. Whilst being very sympathetic to concerns expressed it was requested that no work should proceed until internal discussions at the Borough Council had ben held and a suitable solution agreed. The proposed repair programme was likely to extend into 2024/25 and a similar request for funding may be made by the FoWP group during the next financial year: Resolved,

That

- 1. the report regarding the response from the Borough Council be noted and further consideration be given at the next meeting;
- 2. the request from the FoWP group for the budget provision in 2023/24 of £500 allocated to support their activities being applied towards repairs to the Ranger Cabin be approved and, if necessary, to this amount being carried forward and earmarked as a scheme in 2024/25.

#### 5. <u>Woolston Eyes Conservation area – access and facilities</u>

No further information received (Minute C541(1) 6. – 11 October 2023.

#### 6. <u>Battery Lane Allotment site – entrance gate and site security</u>

Further to Minute C54(1)7. – 11 October 2023, the Clerk reported on consultation with representatives of the Battery Lane Allotment Association on the information provided by Warrington BC. The representatives were satisfied with the options used by the Borough Council at their allotment sites and had requested that the new gate be installed as soon as possible:

Resolved,

That

- 1. the report be accepted;
- 2. to avoid delay the Clerk, in consultation with the Chairman and Vice Chairman and the Chairman of the Finance and General Committee, be authorised to proceed with the provision of a new gate using a contractor approved for this type of work by the Borough Council.

#### 7. Christmas tree 2023

The Clerk reported on the provision of the annual Christmas tree to be sited on A57 Manchester Road/Weir Lane following notification from the Borough Council that this could not be supplied. An alternative contractor had been identified from those use by other parish councils:

#### Resolved,

That the report be accepted and approval be given to the appointment of an alternative contractor.

#### (2) Finance and General Committee

#### 1. <u>Conduct of council meetings and business during the period of the Covid 19</u> <u>pandemic</u>

The Clerk reported and the Council noted current Government guidance on the conduct of council business during the Coronavirus pandemic.

#### 2. Management Accounts 2023/24 - April to June and July to September 2023

#### 3. Development of Capital and Revenue Budget for 2024/25

The Council considered the development of the budget for 2024/25

Resolved,

That the budget for 2024/25 be prepared on a no growth basis.

#### 4. <u>Annual Service of Remembrance - review of arrangements for 2023 and planning</u> of event in 2024

The Council reviewed the organisation and arrangements for the service held on Sunday 12 November 2023.

The Council had agreed to undertake the role of organiser for the service in consultation with the Woolston Church of the Ascension and the local Royal British Legion representative. The Council had also agreed to the continued use of the tiled surface for the event provided through the Borough Council for the area used by the public adjacent to the memorial. A review of this year's event was to be carried out with the Church and RBL representatives:

Resolved,

That

- 1. approval be given for the Council to undertake the role of organiser for the 2025 service in consultation with the Woolston Church of the Ascension and the local RBL representative;
- 2. approval be given to the continued use of the tiled surface or similar for the event area used by the public adjacent to the memorial;
- 3. a report be given following a review of the 2023 event including the type of public address system.

#### 5. <u>Register of Members' interests – publication of information</u>

The Clerk reported that the Borough Council had revised the form for the declaration of information and members were asked to consider if any changes were required to their current information:

Resolved,

That the report be accepted.

#### 6. 2023/24 Local Government Services Pay Agreement

The Clerk reported notification from the National Association of Local Councils of the 2023/24 Local Government Services Pay Agreement effective from April 2023:

Resolved,

That approval be given to the implementation of the agreement.

#### 7. <u>Applications for grant aid</u> <u>– provision of defibrillator</u>

Further to Minute C54(2)7. – 11 October 2023 the Council considered information provided by Councillor Smith on the location of defibrillators in Woolston with public access, using information obtained from the <u>www.debfinder.uk</u> website:

That, having regard to the information provided, support be not given at this time to the provision of further defibrillators.

#### C70 Reports from members appointed to local bodies

- New Cut Heritage and Ecology Trail Group no meeting held. Information was published by the group on their website.
- Friends of Woolston Park group report by Councillor Smith on activities by FoWP group since the last Council meeting and related information: Maintenance of the park environment
  - Regular Monday work days involving: litter picking, cut back of hedges, trimming of bushes, weeding and maintenance of flower beds
  - Cleaning and maintenance of bird boxes
  - Maintenance of the Jubilee Garden, including clearance of mud from paths and the cleaning of brickwork
  - Clearance of verges the full length of the park access road to Somerset Way by two asylum seekers (based at the Holiday Inn)

Maintenance of Ranger Cabin

- Repair to the front door of the Ranger Cabin to strengthen the lower quarter which had suffered damage from water ingress
- Repair to one of the changing room windows
- Assessment of the Ranger Cabin external condition and estimate of the cost of repairs
- Meeting with Warrington Borough Council Environment Services Manager jointly with the Chair of Bruche Athletic on 20 November 2023 to discuss proposals to repair the Ranger Cabin. Details reported separately in a letter from the Chairman of the FoWP group.

Engagement with young people

- A Young Friends event was held on 14 October to make lanterns from pumpkins.
- A Young Friends event was held on 18 November to make Christmas wreaths.
- Weekly visits from students and teachers from Fox Wood special needs school to litter pick have continued

Anti-social behaviour

- There has been an increased use of waste bins in the park to deposit domestic waste
- Fly-tipping of paint and soil was discovered and recovered on 14 October
- Fly-tipping of a fridge freezer and a commercial safe was discovered and recovered/ reported on 27 November

• A total of approximately 1770 hours were logged by the FoWP group and other contributing groups during 2023
